Well folks, the time has arrived when you(we) must all say goodbye to your(our) pastor Laverne DiNino. In doing so I have been asked by the council to serve as your "Bridge Pastor". What is a Bridge Pastor you may be asking? So, I looked up what others say about this term.

Where a church has no pastor for any number of reasons, we consider prayerfully the church's request to supply a **Bridge Pastor** to give daily hands-on direction to the effectiveness and/or reconciliation and healing processes.

Duties of a Bridge Pastor may include:

- Preaching weekly in the church and/or during specially scheduled sessions with a message of encouragement, forgiveness and hope.
- Joining the church staff temporarily to provide daily/ weekly direction, leadership training, help with organizational skills and tips on effectively working with volunteers.
- Advising the elders, deacons or whoever is working to replace the lead pastor with an Interim Pastor.
- Providing Pastoral Care for church members such as hospital visits, emergency counseling.
- Conducting weddings, funerals, baptisms and other pastoral duties as needed.

Being a member at Salem UCC and then being asked to step in as a Bridge Pastor is a challenge. Why, because I'm called to serve in a different role as your pastor, to provide guidance and direction along with that possibility of discipline and order as we as a congregation move forward.

I'm also called to help guide you in your faith journeys which are always different but wonderful life adventures. So, we are to begin our faith journey together.

After the first week or two my hope is to settle in with regular times of being in the office if you desire to meet, talk or have a cup of coffee. I'm looking forward to being with you in a different role during the next 2-3 months as your pastor.

Where Do We Go Next?

Now that Pastor Verne has officially retired from Salem UCC, you may have questions about where we go next. Like a bridge that leads to new destination, the next few months will take us in a new direction. Here are some important points presented in a question and answer format.

- Q: I became close friends with Pastor Verne when she was here. Am I allowed to keep in touch with her?
 - A: Sadly, no. We know that it may be tempting to contact Pastor Verne, but it will be too difficult to separate personal contact from church business. Even on a social basis, contact is discouraged.
- Q: May we contact Pastor Verne to officiate at a wedding, funeral, or baptism?
 - A: That one is a resounding "No!" Pastor Verne would only be involved if she is invited by the current pastor. This generally occurs only when the pastoral duty involved concludes a service already in progress before retirement. An example would be assisting at a wedding if the pre-marital counseling happened at the end of her tenure with Salem UCC.
- Q: Who will provide pastoral services now?
 - A: Rev. Haan Phelps has been engaged by Council to serve as the bridge pastor.
- Q: What are the next steps in filling the pulpit?
 - A: Rev. Phelps will be with us on a short term basis. During that time, Penn Central Conference will compile a list of potential interim pastors. That selection will be the responsibility of Council. Once an interim pastor is in place, Council will appoint a Profile Committee. This group will create a profile of the church facility and the church family, effectively creating the marketing documents that will catch the eye of prospective ministers. As this committee nears the end of its task, Council will appoint a Search Committee.

You may have other questions about what the pastoral vacancy means to Salem UCC and how the position will be filled. Please be assured that Rev. Phelps, Jay, and the Council are committed to open communication and to continuing all current activities and initiatives within our cohesive Salem Faith Community during this transition of leadership. Please do not hesitate to voice your questions, concerns and/or suggestions to Rev. Phelps or Jay Stover, Council president.

Easter Season Worship Theme: "A Place to Call Home"

"In my Father's house there are many dwelling places." ~John 14:2

The scriptures of the Easter Season speak time and again of the family of God, of loving one another as brothers and sisters, children of God. On Easter, a messenger tells the disciples to meet the risen Jesus back at Galilee, the place they began together and the place where they lived and worked together during his ministry. So during these weeks through May 20, Pentecost Sunday, we will consider what it means to have "a place to call home" in our spiritual lives.

April 8, 2018 - All Are Welcome

"How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity!" ~ Psalm 133

Even when we yearn for community, it can be difficult. Sometimes even (and especially) the church gets caught up in fear and starts to lock the doors. But Jesus won't have it. He shows up in the midst of the disciples who've locked themselves in a room, and points them and us toward true community where none is better than another, and none are excluded from the presence and love of the risen Christ.

April 15, 2018 - You're Family

"While they were talking... Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you'... And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet." ~ Luke 24: 36b, 40

To feel "at home" is to know a place and a family where it is safe to be vulnerable. In another of Jesus' post-resurrection appearances to the disciples, he shows them the wounds on his hands and feet. This Sunday we look at what it means to create safe space for bringing all of who we are — wounds and all. For as we are loved by our Creator and Parent, so should we love each other as children of God—sisters and brothers—offering healing community where we may journey together as family toward wholeness.

April 22, 2018 - A Place at the Table

"The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not want... Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff -- they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows."

~ Psalm 23:1, 4-5

Today we focus on "preparing a table" as part of our call as community. Jesus crossed many divides ("in the presence of my enemies") by bringing folks to common tables. This love that crosses divides is what is meant by "radical hospitality." How will we create true "home" in the ways that we help one another, regardless of perceived divisions?

April 29, 2018 - Always Room for One More

"As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?'... He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him."

~ Acts 8: 36-38

The story of Philip and the eunuch (in some ways, an "outsider") expresses the inclusive love of God for all. All are invited to come home to God because love is simply part of our nature, and love is of God.

May 6, 2018 - Residing in Love

"As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love." ~ John 15: 9-10

When we make our home within Christian community, we invest in belonging – being in a particular place with a particular people – having a spiritual home. This does not require us to all have the same perspectives. It only asks of us to be present to each other with love.

May 13 - Always Blessing, Always Blessed

"I have heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love toward all the saints, and for this reason I do not cease to give thanks for you as I remember you in my prayers."

~ Ephesians 1:15-16

Ascension Sunday calls to mind the moment at which Jesus ascends into heaven after having been with the disciples for a while after his resurrection. Another parting—yet this time the scene is not an agonizing death on a cross, rather it is filled with wonder. Each time we gather to worship and bless God, "remembering all in our prayers," we too are continually at home in the promise of Jesus Christ's presence among us.

May 20, 2018 - What's Mine is Yours

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them." ~ Acts 2:1-2

Pentecost comes with the rush of the spirit in wind and fire. As Jesus foretold, the Spirit is shared by all gathered together in spite of their differences of language and culture. The Spirit makes its home

in and through all people.

Please get into the "Spirit" by wearing red on Pentecost Sunday, May 20.



May 27, 2018 - Mysterious Encounter

"Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!"." ~ Isaiah 6:8

On Trinity Sunday we remember with solemnity and praise the foundation in which we live and worship throughout the year. Trinity Sunday is the Sunday after Pentecost. We are invited to encounter God as Three in One. The use of the Triune formula connects the church today with the historic church, born in the struggle of Christians throughout generations to express their beliefs about God in God's Very Being. The language ties together the churches of this generation in our ecumenical life, especially in the Sacrament of Baptism. The traditional language for the Trinity is Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

For many, however, the traditional language is a hindrance to the intimacy of their relationship with God. They note in particular that the tradition incorporates only male language for God, and seek to incorporate other images which point to broader understandings of the substance and characteristics of the Holy Mystery which is our Triune God. "Giver, Gift, and Holy Spirit"; "Maker, Lover, Keeper"; "Father, Son and Holy Spirit, One God, Mother of All"; are some other Trinitarian images drawn from prayerful, scriptural reflection.

Our Scriptures today remind us to remain confident in God's love and to be confident that, for those who seek to live by the truth, we are heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ. Certainly, as with the church of all ages, we express our faith in the Divine, recognizing its Mystery with the awareness that words are not sufficient.








VBS 2018

VBS 2018



Thank you for your donation to Church World Service (CWS)-Lancaster! Your generous gift of \$ 245.00 works to ensure that refugees are offered hope and home when they first arrive to Lancaster, and are continued support and care for years after. Over the past several months refugee arrivals to the United States have continued to be very slow. Overseas processing has slowed dramatically due to medical checks, assurances and security checks expiring; delays in security clearances; and fewer interviews being conducted by the US Department of State. Refugees are simply not being processed in numbers that would allow us to reach the 45,000national capacity ceiling. Instead, the number of arrivals to the US is likely to be between 15,000-25,000 refugees for FY2018.
